## **Version 10.0.1 Fixes**

This chapter describes currently-known defects for the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1. Workarounds are provided whenever possible.

#### **BIOS**

BIOS defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

- 13G Boot Order on page 11
- Dell EMC Jira CES-7739 on page 11

#### 13G Boot Order

**Issue** — The BIOS setting *Non RAID Disk Mode* can cause RAID configuration failures when set to *disabled*. As a result, nodes cannot be provisioned.

Tracking Number — N/A

Workaround — You can update the BIOS to set the boot order:

- 1. Boot to System BIOS.
- 2. Select Device Settings.
- **3.** Select *Integrated NIC 1 Port 1* (this is interface *em1*).
- 4. Select NIC Configuration.
- **5.** Using the dropdown, change the boot protocol from *PXE* to *None*.
- **6.** In sequence, click on the *Back*, *Finish*, *Yes*, and *OK* buttons.
- 7. Repeat steps 2-4 for Integrated NIC 1 Port 3.
  - **a.** This time, change the boot protocol from *None* to *PXE*.
- 8. Reboot to System BIOS.
- 9. Select BIOS Boot Settings.
- 10. Select Hard-Disk Drive Sequence.
- 11. Select Integrated NIC 1 Port 3 Partition 1.
- **12.**Use the + key to move the device to the top of the list.
- **13.**In sequence, click on the *OK*, *Back*, *Back*, *Finish*, Yes, and *OK* buttons.
- **14.**Reboot the system, which should now boot in the proper order.

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7739**

**Issue** — The BIOS setting *Non RAID Disk Mode* can cause RAID configuration failures when set to *disabled*. As a result, nodes cannot be provisioned.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7739

Workaround — On system boot:

- 1. Press [F2] to invoke the BIOS System Setup console.
- Navigate to Device Settings > Integrated Raid Controller 1 > Controller Management > Advanced Controller properties > Non RAID Disk Mode.
- 3. Change the setting from disabled to enabled.
- Continue the system boot process.

Nodes should now be able to be provisioned.

## Cinder and Red Hat Ceph Storage

Cinder and Red Hat Ceph Storage defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-6155**

**Issue** — On clusters with multi-backend storage with Red Hat Ceph Storage as one of the backends, Red Hat Ceph Storage should be the default block storage Cinder backend, but it is not.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-6155

**Workaround** — To set Red Hat Ceph Storage as the default block storage Cinder backend:

- 1. Initiate ssh sessions to each Controller node.
- 2. Edit the *cinder.conf* file, and set the following attribute:

```
$ vi /etc/cinder.conf
default_volume_type = rbd_backend
```

- 3. Save and close cinder.conf.
- 4. Restart the required services:

```
$ sudo pcs resource restart openstack-cinder-api
$ sudo pcs resource restart openstack-cinder-volume
$ sudo pcs resource restart openstack-cinder-backup
$ sudo pcs resource restart openstack-cinder-scheduler
```

**5.** Test by creating a volume, and verifying that the volume created is in a Red Hat Ceph Storage backend:

```
$ cinder create -- display_name volume1 1
$ cinder show volume1
```

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7917**

**Issue** — The following error message, as well as a kernel stack trace, may appear in log files on Red Hat Ceph Storage nodes:

```
WARNING: at fs/xfs/xfs_aops.c:1244 xfs_vm_releasepage
```

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7917

**Workaround** — These messages are informational, do not negatively affect system performance, and can be safely ignored. See <a href="https://access.redhat.com/solutions/2893711">https://access.redhat.com/solutions/2893711</a> for more information.

## **Dell EMC PowerEdge FX and Networking**

Dell EMC PowerEdge FX and Networking defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

Dell EMC Jira CES-7643 on page 12

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7643**

**Issue** — Currently, Dell EMC PowerEdge FX chassis blades are not assigned individual IP addresses via DHCP. Node discovery discovers the chassis' service tag and assigns it to all the blades, which are then all assigned the chassis' IP address.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7643

Workaround — Assign static IP addresses to individual blades in a Dell EMC PowerEdge FX chassis.

## **Deployment**

Deployment defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-6220**

**Issue** — The automation code expects the number of nodes that get registered in Ironic to match the number of nodes in the *sample.ini* and *sample-fx.ini* files. If the number of nodes does not match, then an error is declared.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-6220

**Workaround** — When use\_custom\_instack\_json is set to *True* in the *sample.ini* and *sample-fx.ini* files, the user is responsible for ensuring the Ironic node info (specifically, the iDRAC address) precisely matches the initialization files.

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7650**

**Issue** — Automation fails to delete Ironic nodes in the Overcloud that are in the *clean wait* state during redeployment.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7650

Workaround — To work around the issue:

1. Find the failed node by executing the following command:

```
$ ironic node-list
```

- 2. Note the GUID of the failed node in the output.
- **3.** Delete the node by executing the following commands:

```
$ ironic node-set-maintenance <GUID> False
$ ironic node-set-provision-state <GUID> manage
$ ironic node-delete <GUID>
```

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7740**

**Issue** — The iDRAC console or Web session drops its connection during a Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform installation. This happens when the following commands are run:

- Manual installations: config\_idrac.py
- Automation installations config\_idracs.py

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7740

Workaround — To work around the issue:

Manual installations:

1. After config\_idrac.py completes its run:

- a. Restart the iDRACs.
- **b.** Reset the iDRAC consoles or Web sessions.

Automation installations:

- 1. Monitor the /auto\_results log on the SAH for "config\_idracs.py".
- **2.** After config\_idracs.py completes its run:
  - Restart the iDRACs.
  - **b.** Reset the iDRAC consoles or Web sessions.

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7861**

**Issue** — Red Hat does not support Red Hat OpenStack Platform clusters deployed with two (2) Controller nodes.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7861

**Workaround** — Use three (3) Controller nodes.

#### **Dell EMC Jira CES-7997**

**Issue** — Upon Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform cluster deployment completion the ~/pilot/overcloud\_deployment.log file is zero (0) bytes in size, providing no information about what was deployed.

Tracking Number — Dell EMC Jira CES-7997

Workaround — To work around the issue:

- 1. Depending upon your server architecture, open one of the following files in a text editor of your choice:
  - Dell EMC PowerEdge R-Series sample.ini
  - Dell EMC PowerEdge FX sample-fx.ini
- **2.** Change the deploy\_overcloud\_debug variable setting to *true*.
- 3. Save the file.
- 4. Redeploy the cluster.

The ~/pilot/overcloud\_deployment.log will now contain useful debug data.

# **Horizon and Ephemeral Storage**

Horizon and Ephemeral Storage defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

Launchpad 1678109 on page 14

#### **Launchpad 1678109**

**Issue** — In the Horizon Instance launcher, when selecting Image or Image snapshot as boot source, the *Create New Volume* option is set to **Yes** by default. This will initially create the instance via an image, but then store it on a volume.

Tracking Number — Launchpad 1678109

Workaround — To create a true ephemeral image using Horizon:

- 1. Click on Launch Instance
- Select the following options:
  - a. Select Boot Source = Image

## **Horizon and Red Hat Ceph Storage**

Horizon and Red Hat Ceph Storage defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include

#### **Launchpad 1572635**

**Issue** — Currently, while using the Horizon GUI, if you edit a file on your disk that is stored in a container, an error similar to the following is displayed when you attempt to upload the latest version of that file with the *Update object* control:

```
Object with the name already exists
```

This same operation completes successfully when using the CLI.

Tracking Number — Launchpad 1572635

**Workaround** — Use the CLI to perform this operation, instead of the Horizon GUI.

## **Host Migration**

Host Migration defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 include:

#### Red Hat Bugzilla 1245617

**Issue** — Cold migrate of host does not migrate the instances from source host.

**Tracking Number** — Red Hat Bugzilla 1245617

**Workaround** — Configure SSH keys on the Compute nodes as documented *here*.

#### Red Hat Bugzilla 1267598

Issue — If local ephemeral storage is being used, nova resize operations do not currently function.

**Tracking Number** — Red Hat Bugzilla 1267598

**Workaround** — Configure SSH keys on the Compute nodes as documented *here*.

## **Instance High Availability**

Instance HA defects in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, version 10.0.1 inlude:

### Red Hat Bugzilla 1386420, 1441368

**Issue** — Currently, instances will work on the first attempt to evacuate them from a node, but will go into an ERROR state if you attempt to evacuate them a second time.

Workaround — None.

## Failing Tests

#### **Failing Tests**

#### Cinder

These tests are invalid if backends defined in cinder.conf do not declare vendor\_name or storage protocol attibutes. The backend will be valid and fully functional, but the test will fail and should be ignored in such cases.

```
tempest.api.volume.admin.test_volume_types.VolumeTypesV1Test.test_
volume_crud_with_volume_type_and_extra_specs
tempest.api.volume.admin.test_
volume_types.VolumeTypesV2Test.test_volume_crud_with_volume_type_and_
extra_specs
```

Cinder backup service is not deployed and configured in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, thus the following backup related tests will fail.

```
tempest.api.volume.admin.test_volumes_backup.VolumesBackupsV1Test.*
tempest.api.volume.admin.test_volumes_backup.VolumesBackupsV2Test.*
```

Encrypted volumes are not configured in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform by default, thus the following encrypted volume related tests will fail.

```
tempest.scenario.test_encrypted_cinder_
volumes.TestEncryptedCinderVolumes.test_encrypted_cinder_volumes_cryptsetup
tempest.scenario.test_encrypted_cinder_
volumes.TestEncryptedCinderVolumes.test_encrypted_cinder_volumes_luks
```

#### Neutron

Neturon Distributed Virtual Router (DVR) has production support in the Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform, albeit with some limited functionality. The following tests may fail depending on the Neutron configuration.

```
neutron.tests.tempest.api.admin.test_routers_
dvr.RoutersTestDVR.test_centralized_router_update_to_dvr
neutron.tests.tempest.api.test_routers.DvrRoutersTest.test_
convert_centralized_router
```

Nova

These tests are failing due to regression in an RHOSP 10 configuration option: nova.conf#schedule\_filter. The default has changed and passing incorrect scheduler\_hints to the following tempest tests, causing the tests to fail. See logged Bugzilla defect: 1441809

```
tempest.api.compute.admin.test_servers_on_
multinodes.ServersOnMultiNodesTest.test_create_servers_on_different_hosts

tempest.api.compute.admin.test_servers_on_
multinodes.ServersOnMultiNodesTest.test_create_servers_on_same_host
```

#### **Telemetry**

Telemetry installation is now configured to use Gnocchi in Dell EMC Ready Bundle for Red Hat OpenStack Platform. Please use the Gnocchi API available on the metric endpoint to retrieve data. Therefore Ceilometer API tests may fail.

```
ceilometer.tests.tempest.api.test_telemetry_
notification_api.TelemetryNotificationAPITest.test_check_
glance_v1_notifications
